COVID-19 is a viral infection caused by the SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus. The virus can spread from an infected person's mouth or nose when they cough, sneeze, speak, sing or breathe. The COVID-19 virus can mutate quickly and has the potential to spread rapidly.

According to World Health Organisation, long COVID is the continuation or development of new symptoms 3 months after the initial SARS-CoV-2 infection, with these symptoms lasting for at least 2 months with no other explanation^{4,5}.

Studies show that around 10–20% of people infected by SARS-CoV-2 may go on to develop symptoms that can be diagnosed as long COVID⁶.


PERSONS WHO LIVE IN **AGED CARE FACILITIES**

PERSONS WHO ARE *MEDICALLY **VULNERABLE AND ARE AGED 12 YEARS+**

Children (6 months and older) and adults, particular, healthcare workers, as well as household members and caregivers of medically vulnerable individuals are encouraged to receive the additional dose of the updated vaccine.⁷

Over time, there is a reduction in protection offered by COVID-19 vaccines and infection. Additional updated COVID-19 vaccine doses can help restore protection that has decreased since previous vaccination.8

*Medical Vulnerable refers to (a) Persons who are aged 60 and above (b) Patients who are immunocompromised or have concurrent medical conditions such as obesity (e.g., adults with a BMI >31, hypertension, diabetes, chronic heart and lung diseases, kidney diseases on dialysis, hypercoagulable states, cancer, or patients on drugs that cause immunosuppression; (c) Pregnant women; (d) Persons with Down's syndrome¹⁰
